

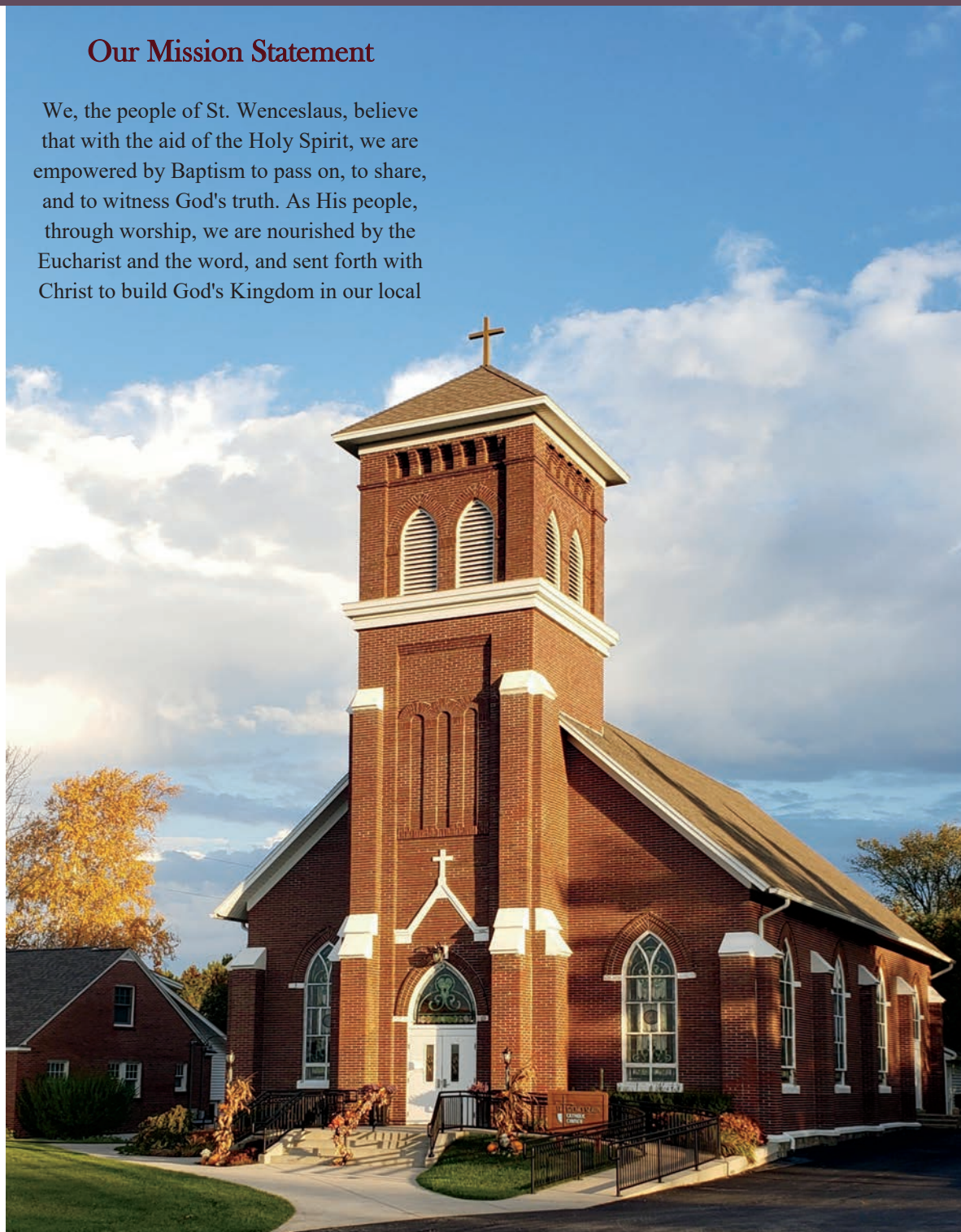

Today is the Second Sunday of Advent. The Gospel for today is Matthew 3:1-12, John the Baptist is preaching in the desert: "Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." He tells them that every tree that does not bear good fruit, will be cut down and thrown into the fire. Someone greater than he is coming. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. He will gather the wheat into His barns and the chaff He will burn.
