

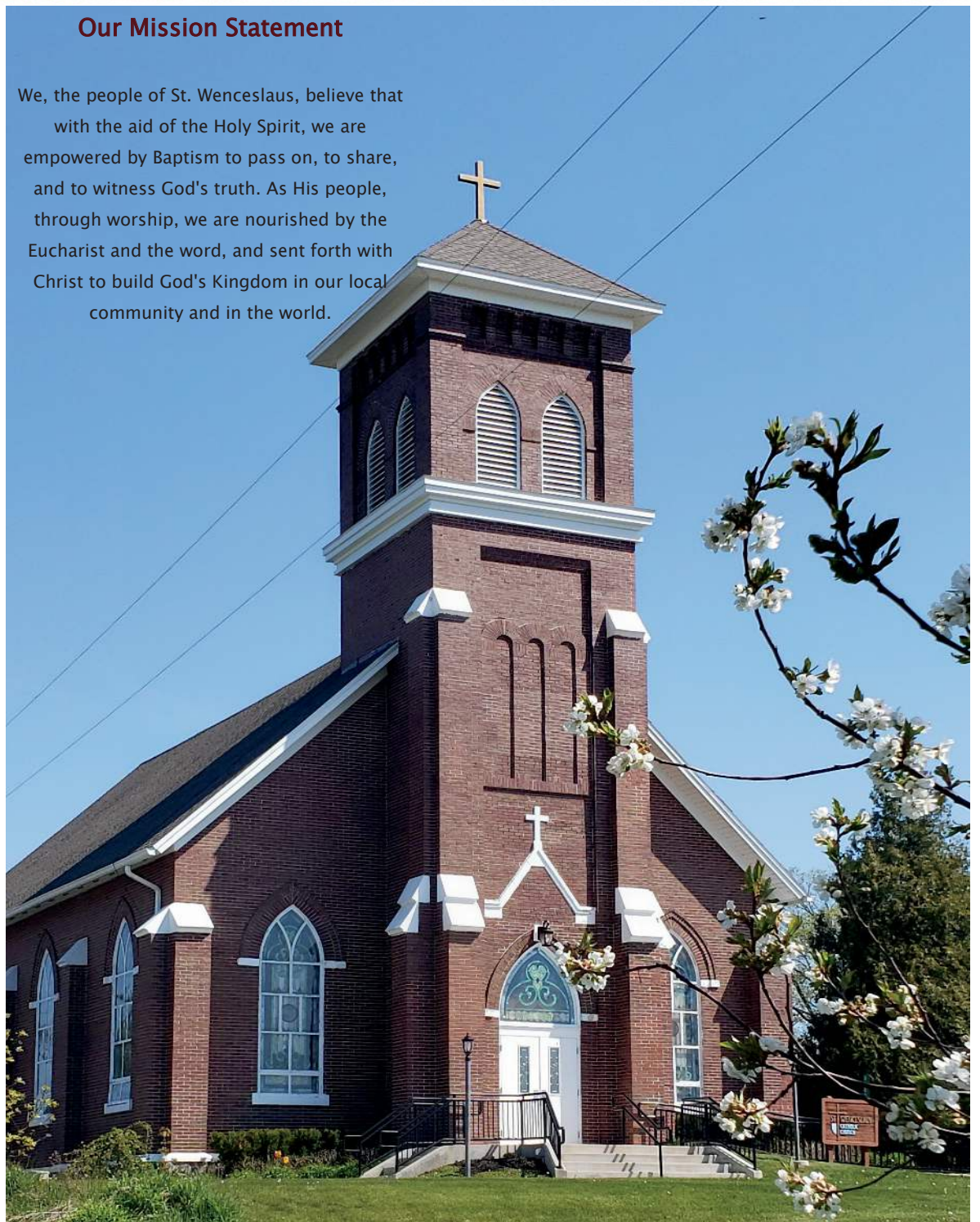

Dear Friends in Christ,

In today's liturgy, from Matthew 9:36–10:8, as Jesus looks at the crowd, His heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Jesus is a man for others. His heart overflows in concern and compassion for the suffering crowds of people following Him. He sees how much they long for a better life, for a deeper understanding of the meaning of life, how to sort out all the pieces of this broken world. Why?

Jesus is not indifferent to these crowds: He cares. They matter to Him. And Jesus hasn't changed; He is not indifferent to us. He knows our hidden sufferings, fears, hopes, and dreams, and He cares about them. We matter to Him. Our needs are His needs. He knows what it feels like to feel abandoned. His closest friends abandoned Him at Calvary. Mary felt helpless at the foot of the cross. Many who have gone before us, who have had their communities destroyed and their members scattered, have survived. The Israelite's were slaves in Egypt and experienced the Babylonian exile. The apostles were all but one martyred.

They never lost their faith in God. They all trusted in God to the end. When times are difficult, remember, that's when God is the closest. It is like the poem: "Foot Steps in the Sand".

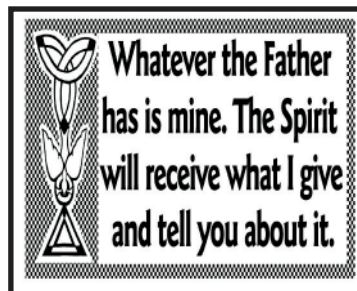
